A MISSIONARY OPTION TO THE PERIPHERIES (as a Priority of the Province)

MISSIONARIES-TO-BE UNDERGO CAMIGUIN EXPOSURE

June, the time of departure for mission assignments to the Babuyanes, is fast approaching. Understandably, the three of us, Frs. Rommel Olivar, OP, Felix de los Reyes, Jr., OP, and Art Vincent Pangan, OP, whose turn is to serve as missionaries, have been looking forward to seeing the place. And so last March 10-17, Fr. Joemar Sibug, OP, the Promoter for the Missions of the DPPI, brought us there for a foretaste of missionary life.

The exposure began on March 10, Saturday evening, with a 12-hour bus ride from Manila, ending on Sunday morning with a short rest at Lyceum of Aparri. There, Dadang, an environmentalist-friend of Fr. Joemar, joined us. In the afternoon, we left for an overnight stay at Punta Sta. Ana, at the beautiful resort owned by Dr. Raul Ting, another environmentalist, who gave us a situationer of the politics of Cagayan Valley and how it has impacted on the environment. We returned to Aparri on Monday morning and stayed overnight at the St. Thomas Aquinas Major Seminary located within the campus of the Lyceum of Aparri.



Fr. Joemar planned on leaving for Camiguin on Sunday, but the waves and the weather did not cooperate, so it was only on an overcast Tuesday morning that we were able to take the boat to the island. On the boat with us were the cast of ABS-CBN's *Born to be Wild* who were off for a two-week shoot of the whales in Camiguin. The huge waves that had brought fear to many visitors thankfully did not materialize as the winds were not that strong, but a damaged propeller extended the travel time from the ordinary three hours to six hours. And so it was late in the afternoon when we arrived at the newly-renovated and



very beautiful convent of the parish. That evening, Fr. John Stephen Besa, OP, the Director of Lyceum of Camiguin and *de facto* Parish Priest of St. Vincent Ferrer Parish, treated us to a delicious dinner of rock lobsters.

Morning of Wednesday, we gave a recollection to the graduating Grade 12 students of the Lyceum. The head teacher also gave us a tour of the school. Founded in 1967 by Dominican missionaries, the school has been improving its facilities; new buildings have been constructed with the help of Letran-Intramuros and the DPPI. Enrolment has been constant at about 200 for both junior and senior high school levels, purposely held there to maintain quality. Fr. Besa confided however that retaining teachers remains a problem. The high salaries being offered by the public schools make it difficult to retain experienced and qualified instructors.



In the afternoon, we celebrated Mass with the faculty and the students, with Fr. Arvin as the main celebrant, and then we went for a walk along the island, marvelling at its beaches and its genial inhabitants. After another delicious dinner, Fr. JS gave an informative overview of the island's economics, politics, religious situation, and the challenges facing those who will be assigned there. In particular, there is a need for another friar to take care of the parish. All in all, he said, it's a peaceful life with many avenues for a dedicated missionary to use his God-given talents.

Thursday, we were supposed to go to Calayan, but the uncertain weather made the trip dangerous, so Fr. Joemar instead gave us a tour of Camiguin's interesting sites: the hot spring at Mararag Point (boiling water seeps from underground, right at the seashore), Pinon Islet (with the marvellous view of the Babuyan Channel), and Pamuctan Island. The evening was also memorable as Fr. Joemar had an advanced celebration of his silver anniversary of priestly ordination with a sumptuous dinner of *lechon* (roasted right there on the convent grounds) attended by Camigueno friends and the cast of *Born to be Wild*.

Friday was our last day at Camiguin. We left the island early morning. Mercifully, the weather held for the threehour boat ride from Camiguin to Sta. Ana. From there, we travelled by van to Aparri for lunch and proceeded back to Manila via Florida bus. It was early morning of Saturday when we arrived at Bahay Dominiko, exhausted but excited for the return to Camiguin and Calayan for a longer stint, this time as full-fledged missionaries.

MISSION PROMOTER RELAUNCHES "SEND A CHILD TO SCHOOL"

Fr. Jose Martin L. Sibug, OP, Promoter of the Missions, recently re-launched the educational sponsorship program "Send A Child To School". It is one of the programs of the Commission on Missions that promotes poverty alleviation through education. It supports the education of the youth in remote Babuyan Islands through a sponsorship program for students. It also helps in the construction of school buildings like classrooms and libraries, and provides students with tools for their education.

Last March 21, 2018, Fr. Sibug held a meeting with the heads of the Extension Services of some of the schools under the Dominican Province of the Philippines and members of the Dominican Family. The meeting was attended by: Mr. Leo Bernadas, Head of the Center for Community Development of Colegio de San Juan de Letran



Manila who was accompanied by two of his staff; Mr. Mark Anthony Abenir from the University of Santo Tomas who is the Director of UST Simbahayan, the extension services arm of the University; Ms. Delia Alcantara from the Extension Services Office of UST-Angelicum; Dr. Belen Tangco, OP, President of the Provincial Council of Lay Dominican Fraternities in the Philippines; and Anju Castigador, President of Filii Sancti Dominici.

Fr. Sibug explained to the group the mechanics and details of "Send A Child To School". As an educational sponsorship program, its aim is to look for sponsors for the tuition fees of junior and senior high school students of Lyceum of Camiguin. The students of the Lyceum of Camiguin, a mission school of the Dominican Province of the Philippines in Camiguin Norte mission station, are the beneficiaries of this program.

Camiguin Norte, one of the islands in the Babuyanes, is a poor island that belongs to the 3rd class municipality of Calayan in Cagayan Province. For a donation of ₱500 a month for 10 months or ₱5,000 for one school year, sponsors are able to send children to school in remote Babuyan Islands.



Fr. Sibug also gave a presentation during the National Conference of the Dominican Laity of the Philippine Province last April 8, 2018. He promoted the "Send A Child To School" program through a very touching and moving PowerPoint presentation about Camiguin Norte island. He shared about the life of the poor school children in Camiguin Norte and how a group of teachers and students from Colegio de San Juan de Letran in Manila took up the advocacy of sending children to school after their near-death experience when the boat they were riding on capsized off Aparri in Cagayan Province while on their return trip from the island to Aparri.

At present, there are already many college graduates who were once beneficiaries of the "Send A Child To School" program. One of them is Sharmaine Javier. She graduated from Lyceum of Camiguin as valedictorian in 2011. She studied in Letran as a student assistant and

took up BS Education Major in English. After her college graduation in 2015, she went back to Camiguin Norte to teach in Lyceum of Camiguin. She is now the academic coordinator of the school and an English teacher in the junior and senior high school.

TRADTALK SERIES: JESUS IN THE QUR'AN

Br. Simon Peter Ramos, OP, a student-brother specializing in Islamic Studies gave a talk on how the Qur'an viewed Jesus last March 9, 2018, from 8:30 pm to 10:00 pm at the Dominican Studentate Community Room during the monthly TRADTALK of the community.



Br. Ramos started his talk by presenting the importance of studying Islam and its doctrine by quoting some of the documents of the Church especially those documents that highlighted the importance of ecumenism and inter-



religious dialogue. He then proceeded by presenting some texts from the Qur'an which show some narratives depicting Jesus' identity which have semblance with the Catholic Bible. He also presented some concepts which explain the beliefs and doctrines of the followers of Allah and at the same time show the role of other characters like Mohammad in the development of the doctrine of Islam in the Qur'an. He ended his talk by highlighting that one needs to respect the beliefs of the followers of Allah while guarding one's own faith. Furthermore, he said that if there is one thing that one can learn from Islam, it is their strong conviction in their beliefs.



After the talk, some of the brothers, including the Master of Students, Fr. Ramon Salibay, OP and his assistants, Fr. Marcelino Saria, OP, and Fr. Rudolf Steven Seño, OP, asked questions and shared their thoughts regarding the topic.

Simple Professed Religious from different Congregations, with some lay affiliates and lay scholars of KADAUPAN, attended the event. The guest speakers were Agent Lirio T. Ilao, the Chief of Operations Management Division of the Plans and Operations Service of The Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency (PDEA); Ms. Christina Palabay of KARAPATAN Alliance on Human Rights, an NGO tracking the rise of human rights violation in the Philippines; Bro. Rommel Reyes, a rehabilitated drug user and currently a lay preacher; and Most. Rev. Pablo Virgilio "Ambo" David, DD, bishop of the Diocese of Kalookan.

The participants were informed about the achievements and goals of the drug war of the Philippine government. They were challenged to uphold human rights, encourage the drug addicts to undergo rehabilitation and inculcate in them the protection of human life. The event culminated with the celebration of the Holy Eucharist presided over by Rev. Fr. Carlo Rey Canto, OP, a former member of the JSF Core Group.



human frailty, still cannot forgive: "Don't feel guilty that you cannot forgive... forgiveness is a process. Undeserved suffering, when made into a prayer and offered to God, becomes an act of forgiveness."

In Christ's words to the repentant thief, Fr. Filemon Dela Cruz, Jr., OP, gave hopeful assurance to the gnawing anxiety of being buried in oblivion, for, *"Ang*

buried in

kinalilimutan ay naiiwan." Jesus assures us that he always remembers us, and holds our lives meaningful in His eyes.

Fr. Sonny Ramirez, OP, reminded families of their infinite value to Christ. If families are shattered, Fr. Ramirez imagined the crucified Christs lamenting, "Eh, Bakit pa ako naririto? Bakit kailangan pa akong maghirap? Bakit kailangan akong mamatay? Para kanino, kung hindi para sa pamilya."



Fr. Christopher Garinganao, OP, emphasized the difference between *habilin* and *pabaya*. He asks us to reflect on the culture of *pabaya* in our society which made Christ ask the Father, *Bakit mo ako pinabayaan sa kamay nila?* He reminded us, *"Si Kristo hindi nagpapabaya,"* and so should we.

Fr. Rodel Aligan, OP, said, "All of us here are being called by God for something great and noble, and that is what our heart is thirsting for."

Fr. Edmund Nantes reminded married couples of the importance of maintaining a healthy and loving relationship, which would render divorce unnecessary to our society.

Fr. Tereso Campillo, Jr., OP, inspired by Jesus' child-like trust and surrender to the Father, was emphatic about the importance of unconditional love and acceptance that children should experience from their parents. *"Kapag ang anak ay walang-wala na, bagsak na bagsak na, doon mas mahalaga na marinig ng anak ang mga ito [a parent's approval]"*



A recurrent thread that ran through their preaching was the inviolable sanctity of the family. SILVER ANNIVERSARY OF PRESBYTERAL ORDINATION

Three of our brethren recently celebrated their Silver Anniversary of Priestly Ordination last March 24, 2018 with a Eucharistic celebration held at 9:00 o'clock in the morning at the altar of the Blessed Virgin Mary at Sto. Domingo Church in Quezon City. Fr. Isaias Tiongco, OP, Fr. Jose Martin Sibug, OP and Fr. Greg Gregory, OP, were ordained to the Sacred Order of Priesthood 25 years ago on March 25, 1993.

At present, Fr. Isaias Tiongco, OP, who hails from Guagua, Pampanga, is assigned to the Priory of St. Thomas Aquinas and teaches Canon Law at the Ecclesiastical Faculties of the University of Santo Tomas. Fr. Jose Martin Sibug, OP, whose hometown is Malabon, Metro Manila, is assigned to Bahay Dominiko and is presently the Promoter of the Missions. He is also the Promoter of Evangelization through Social Communication and at the same time the



Assistant Vocation Promoter of the Province. Fr. Greg Gregory, OP, a native of Panabo City, Davao del Norte, is assigned to St. Antoninus House in Davao City and is the Chaplain of San Pedro College.

- ∞ On the Request of the Promoter of Vocations The Provincial Council resolved that:
 - The Praver for Vocations (printed in the *Preces*) be recited daily in the respective houses and convents.
 - During benedictions held in the houses of formation, intentions will be served for the vocations to the Order.
